More than Sundays

There is a long-standing joke about the work of a Vicar being just the one day a week – just Sundays. But of course, we know that the Church is busy seven days a week, and I'm not talking about the building, but the Church as the people of God. As a Benefice, we are busy in our community throughout the week, from the Foodbank to coffee mornings, Make Lunch to our schools work, including Early Intervention. Over the last five years, we have deliberately sought to make a difference in our community, particularly for children and families who are struggling.

The Children and Families Alliance, an informal partnership of three national charities, including Home for Good and Safe Families, Transforming Lives for Good (TLG) and Kids Matter, has published a report today called *More than Sundays*, which demonstrates how churches are uniquely positioned to support children and families, and how they believe that the Church is an important collaborator for government and public services, so that working together we can make a real difference in the lives of families and children.

As a Benefice, we have been partnered with TLG for over three years, offering both Make Lunch and Early Intervention. In that time, we have delivered 342 hours of one-to-one coaching, 53 sessions of Make Lunch and 831 individual meals. I would like to thank all the amazing volunteers from our Benefice who have made this possible.

The More than Sundays report highlights the challenges for children in our country at this time. 4.5 million children live in poverty, I in 6 children has a mental health challenge, and I in 5 children are not meeting expected milestones by the end of their first year in school. It recognises three main barriers to children flourishing: isolation, trauma and poverty.

But the *More than Sundays* report is also bold to give a solution: the Church. The Church is a ready and well-positioned strategic partner for government because of its scale and presence in every community, because of its amazing volunteers and because it already has resources, kitchens, halls and buildings in every village, town and city. Of course we know this, because we are part of this.

I encourage you to read the report, which is short and bright (scan the QR code or visit https://tinyurl.com/3pjsa7f9). It also comes with a beautifully created video that explains the work of the three charities, which is the work we are already involved in. I say it again, thank you to everyone who has worked so hard in our community for our children.
